Dear Mary, Yours of May 24" at hand this morning June 7 was indeed thankfull to here that you and the children ware well, for that is one of the greatest blessings that we can have, when we have got that we can put up with most any think els. I most all ways get your letter every monday morning when I come down from the bed room it is laying on the table, so you know I look forward to that time. I love to here from you and to just know how you are feeling. You know I can tell how you feel by the spirit of your letters weather you tell me or not. I am so well a quainted with you. I don't know of any body that I can read like I can you, and I don't think you have got over the bluse yet by the way you write, the bluse you said you had all week. I know it is lonely for you after loosing our sweet Babe, and it is hard for you to get over it, but you say you don't see why he should have died and others get well. But you shouldn't feel that way and I don't think that Lord is pleased with us when we cultivate that spirit. But we should feel thankfull that he has spaired us three that is just as dear to us has the baby and we should thank our Father in Heven that it is know worse than it is. You no I was out tracting this morning and I got in a conversation with a woman that was telling me her truble, she said she had seven children and they have all died some of them lived to grow up her Husband allso has died and she as lost here site gon blind, think of it and there is so many cases like this all over the world.

And now I wish you would look at it in a nother lite, and be thankfull that it isent any worse than what it is. Now you know the more you cultivate that spirit of morning the more you will and it will finally be come cronick, and what good does it do to let every little thing that comes a long up set you. Why every body as to put up with these things, and our children isent any dearer to us than other peoples are to them. But then I know you will fell all rite or better by the time you get this and don't think you was to ancious for me to come becaus you know we wouldent eather of us feel verry good if I wasent here. Tell your Pa that I will go and see his neace but would be a fraid to try to get her to get out there because they are acusing us all the time of getting whimen to go out to Utah. Tell Elvera I think she ought to be writing a letter to me and does Willie think it is time that I am coming home bless his little heart and he will for get all a bout me be fore I get home wont he.

Does little Loviny ever say any thing about me. Now Mary do what I tell you take care of yourself and be thank full for our lot as it is, and the Lord will bless you. it looks as though Hart was not guilty the way the jury hung this time. We had a nice meeting last knight quite a number of investigators. went to Preston Saturday to priest-hood meeting. I told you in my last letter that I was going to London the rates will be on the 19 of this month but I don't think I will have a nough money to do me untill I get some from home. you no I told you in my last letter to get two or three checks and send them to me then I can make out what I want, but if I don't go to London I will be able to go I think before I come home.

Of course this is a reunion of all the Elders of the British Mission, would some over two hundred fifty. May the Lord bless you Mary that you may not think your trials are more than any body's else's, and don't pay any attention what people say and especially what people say they have heard and come and tell you.

And take care of your self because I don't want to come home and find you looking ten years older than what you are. Two years will soon pass and I look forward to the time when I will be living at home again with you and the children. It has been the happiest time of my life and I think I will be still happier when I return home from filling an honorable mission. You know you are more to me than any thing else on this earth so get to feeling good about our little trials and that will make me feel good and I know you want to make me happy. Please don't let any body read my letters because they sound a little soft to some people.
