will do Lucine good & know.

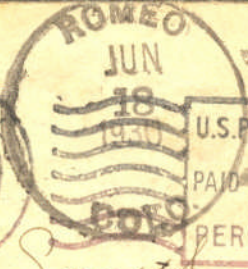
Josephine and Agnes had got
