Josephine Jackson Jones remember her grandmother Hannah Marie Jaques Jackson:

She was hard of hearing, from measles or scarlet fever, so held a big horn up to her ear so she could hear better. When I was a young girl of five or six, I was out gathering eggs for my mother, and I found a tiny, bird-egg-size egg. The hens laid these occasionally. I was so thrilled and ran over to show it to Grandma Jackson. She just grabbed it out of my hand and ran out the kitchen door and threw it up over the house. Evidently she considered it a bad omen and was trying to break its evil spell. I also remember her drying apples in the fall. She would lay the apple slices out on cheese cloth on the porch roof.

The Samuel Jackson Sr. home in Manassa was still standing in 1999 but had been painted white. Samuel had two wives. Martha, the second wife, lived upstairs and had a millinery shop there. Later she had her own, separate home. Hannah Marie, the first wife, lived downstairs. The kitchen had two flour bins, one for each wife.
