We are thus well advertized and people generally seem very concerned over us. Some are desirous of hearing our testimony, and some want us driven from the town. More has been done by the enemy towards warning the people in a short time than we could do in a year, and we may therefore see how easy it is for God to make the wrath of man further His purposes."
